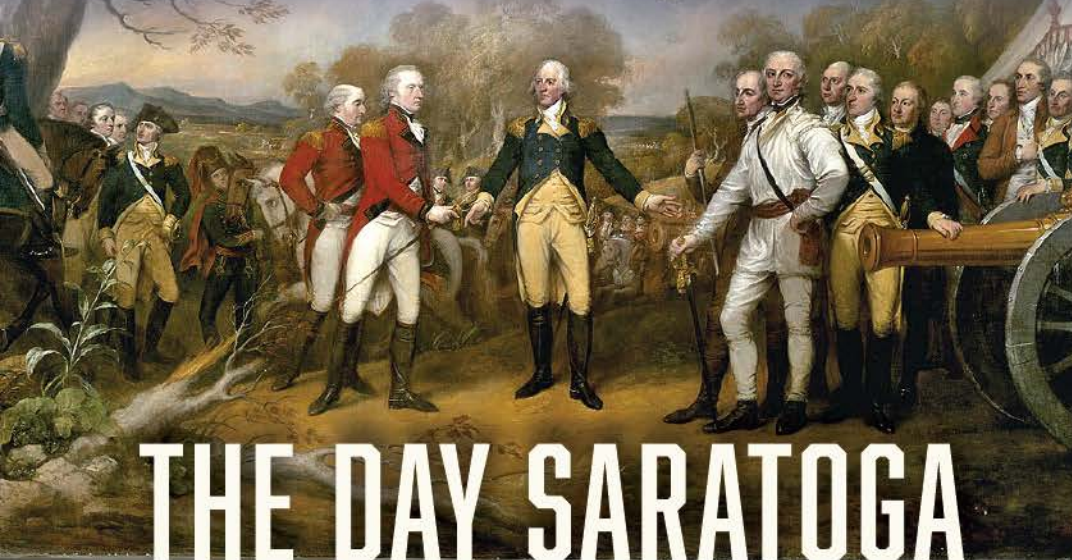

“Yankee Doodle” was originally sung by the British
military officers to mock the American colonists, the
shabby “Yankees,” with whom they fought with during
the French and Indian War (1754–1763). Later, the
song became popular amongst Americans as a song of
defiance. They would then add verses to mock the
British troops and simultaneously pay tribute to General
George Washington, who was the Commander of the
Continental army.
